A grade of "C" or better is required in all prerequisite courses and in all courses specified by course numbers in the summary of required hours.

Note: Any program directed or technical electives, all Allied Health programs, Associate of Science in Teaching, and Technical Certificates requires "C" or better in all course work. Transfer students should be aware of policies of the institution where he/she intends to transfer; a course with a "D" grade may not be eligible for use when transferring.

A.A., A.S., and A.S.T. transfer degrees

Transfer degree students must complete a history sequence.

*Take a six-hour sequence in History of World Civilizations (HIST 1110, 1120) or United States History (HIST 2010, 2020). One course in Tennessee History (HIST 2030) may be substituted for one course in United States History. **Students who have completed three hours in Western Civilization (HIST 1010 or HIST 1020) should contact the History department for course offering.***

A student who plans to transfer to TBR universities should take the US History sequence, if one year in American History was not completed in high school. Students who plan to transfer to UT system or an out of state or private university should check requirements and take appropriate sequence.
