

The Technology Education concentration is intended for non-credentialed teachers in technical education programs at Tennessee Technology Centers, in high school technical education programs, and in proprietary technology schools. The program will provide an A.A.S. degree, which is the minimum SACS-approved credential for faculty in such programs. To gain admission to this program, students must present evidence of education and/or training in a technical area.

What will I do on the job?

You will provide instruction for occupations that require specialized training such as classes in welding, automotive technology, medical assistant, or cosmetology, for example. You will most likely teach in an industrial or laboratory setting where students are provided hands-on experience.

Develop your skills in public speaking, teaching others, time management, writing and active listening. You will need to be able to select and use training methods and procedures appropriate for the situation.
