What will I do on the job?

Paralegals help lawyers prepare for closings, hearings, trials and corporate meetings. Paralegals also research and investigate the facts of cases, identify appropriate laws, judicial decisions, legal articles and other materials that are relevant to assigned cases. After analyzing and organizing the information, paralegals may prepare written reports that attorneys use in determining how cases should be handled. Paralegals might also help draft contracts, mortgages and separation agreements.

What skills will I use on the job?

You will need to be detail oriented and organized and should enjoy doing research. Good written and oral communication skills are vital. The paralegal must also be able to follow directions and work well independently as well as in a team.
