What Will I Do On The Job?

Paralegals help lawyers prepare for closing, hearings, trials and corporate meetings. Paralegals also research and investigate the facts of cases, identify appropriate laws, judicial decisions, legal articles, and other materials that are relevant to assigned cases. After analyzing and organizing the information, paralegals may prepare written reports that attorneys use in determining how cases should be handled. Paralegals might also help draft contracts, mortgages and separation agreements.

What Skills Will I Use On The Job?

You will need to be detailed oriented and organized and should enjoy doing research. Good written and oral communication skills are vital. The paralegal must be also be able to follow directions and work well independently as well as in a team.

Who Will Hire Me?

Private law firms continue to be the largest employers of paralegals, but a growing array of other organizations, such as corporate legal departments, insurance companies, real estate brokers and title insurance firms and banks also hire paralegals.
