DID YOU KNOW?

- The 1997 animated movie *Anastasia* that this musical is based on was produced by 20th Century Fox, and was not acquired by Disney until 2019
- The movie shares the same plot as a 1952 play by Marcelle Maurette and a 1956 film
- There really was a mystery as to whether Anastasia had survived. Women did impersonate Anastasia in an attempt to gain social status and wealth (most notably a woman named Anna Anderson). It was not until 2007 that DNA testing confirmed that all of the Romanovs, including Anastasia, had indeed been killed on the same day. (Meaning the movie was created before they knew for sure if she had escaped!)





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
